Stabilizing and Strengthening Youth in Crisis

In partnership with Riverside Community Care, The Home's Youth Community Crisis Stabilization (YCCS) Program is a new, shortterm service for youth ages 13-18 who have experienced a mental health crisis and require a high level of care. Designed as a less-restrictive alternative to an inpatient facility—with



many of the same services—the YCCS Program's robust offerings include nursing oversight, medication management, clinical interventions for individuals, groups and families, and access to therapeutic programming. We offer staff-secure care with a high level of supervision and structure in a comfortable, youth- and family-friendly setting that is conducive to recovery. Our goal is to help youth restore functioning, strengthen their resources and capacities, and ensure a timely, successful return to their communities.

THE NEED



Due to the nationwide mental health crisis, there are more youth in need of inpatient, short-term clinical care than there are available beds. Young people who have been hospitalized for acute mental health issues are boarding in emergency departments for weeks or being discharged and sent home for services.

OUR IMPACT



Children experiencing a mental health emergency shouldn't have to wait to receive stabilization services and specialized programming. Now mobile crisis teams and ERs can refer children to the YCCS for specialized treatment and interventions and immediate access to psychiatric care and therapy.

About YCCS

Located at The Home in Walpole, the Youth Community Crisis Stabilization Program is a 24-hour diversionary service operated by The Home and contracted by Riverside Community Care. The YCCS serves 15 adolescents of all genders, ages 13 to 18 years, referred by mobile crisis teams and emergency rooms for short-term care. Please fax referrals to **781-468-7830**. We offer therapeutic programming seven days a week, including weekends and holidays, with admissions accepted 24 hours a day, 365 days per year. All insurances accepted.
